The assessment process of the B.A-Ed programme will comprise coursework in which a student will sit for examinations and assessed at 30% continuous assessment and 70% final Examination.

- 1 Each course carries 100% marks. The final examination counts for 70% of the total marks. Coursework carries 30% of the total marks
- 2 A candidate shall be regarded to have passed a course if he/she attains a minimum of 40% (C) in each course
- 5.5 Weight of each component in the final assessment of the programme All courses will be examined during the coursework in the following manner:
  - Main Timed Test 30% (orex/ online assignment / or pen and paper)
    - Annual Examination 70% (Pen and paper)
    - The pass mark for each course shall be 40%.

#### 6.0 Courses Description

The B.A (Ed) programme shall extend for a minimum period of three calendar years and maximum period of eight calendar years. The candidate is required to take a total of 40 units for completion. That means 2 general courses (2 units), Basic Education Courses (14 units) and two teaching subjects chosen by the student (@ 12 units= 24 Units).
